# **Program Overview**

- The Louisiana Health Access Program is a funding source that can provide assistance with medication for uninsured individuals and cost shares for insured individuals.
- The Louisiana Health Insurance Program
   (HIP) is a federally funded program through
   the Office of Public Health's STD/HIV
   Program.
- The purpose of HIP is to assist qualified individuals with payments to insurance providers for health and dental premiums as well as co-payments and deductibles as specified by the applicant's insurance plan, for services such as laboratory, dental, vision and doctor's visits
- Eligibility
- Louisiana Residency
- Income Not Exceeding 400% of Federal Poverty Level
- Creditable Insurance Coverage

#### <u>Individuals CANNOT BE eligible for full</u> Medicaid

In Louisiana, full Medicaid is open to anyone with an income below 138% of the Federal Poverty Guideline who meets U.S. citizenship requirements, is between the ages of 19 and 64, and doesn't and doesn't already qualify for Medicare.

# Frequently Asked Questions



#### What's the difference between LA HAP and HIP?

HIP (the Health Insurance Program) is a part of LA HAP –it's the part of LA HAP that pays your healthcare bills if you have insurance. If you are a LA HAP client but you don't have insurance, you're not a HIP client. LA HAP covers the costs of your medications only.

#### What parts of Medicare will LA HAP cover?

LA HAP can cover costs associated with Part B, Part C (Medicare Advantage), Part D, and Supplemental (Medigap) plans. Because Part A refers to inpatient hospital care, LA HAP cannot cover any costs associated with Part A.

#### How long does my LA HAP eligibility last?

Each eligibility period lasts 6-months. Then, you need to "re-certify" to continue your eligibility. Note that eligibility is based on your month, not date of birth. Example: Your application is approved September 10. Your eligibility period goes from September 10 to March 31 (the end of the month that is 6- months after the month in which you are approved).

A component of LA HAP that is administered by a community-based organization that processes payments to Medical and Dental Providers on behalf of LA HAP Members.

### Information

- In order to be eligible for HIP, consumers must have a primary insurance provider (Medicare, commercial insurance, ACA, Group Insurance or Cobra)
- HIP pays for health, vision and dental premiums, co-payments/coinsurance/cost share and deductibles for program participants
- If the services rendered are not covered or is denied by the primary insurance carrier, the services are NOT eligible for reimbursement by HIP
- HIP will not reimburse consumers for payments made directly to providers
- Forward HCFA-1500 (Health Insurance Claim Form) or the bill/invoice from the provider as well as an Explanation of Benefits (EOB) from the primary insurer to:
